Jesus said, *"It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."* –Acts 1:7-8



At our annual meeting in January we shared together some new learnings and truths about ourselves as a congregation. One of our volunteers commented to me some time ago, "You know, Pastor Chris, Good Shepherd is actually really good at change we just forget that we know how to do this!" Well, we have moved through a great deal of change since January. This column serves as a mid-year check-in since that meeting.

I mentioned the positive budget situation that existed as we moved into summer. Offerings are traditionally lower in the summer, so please continue your faithful giving as we continue to do the good work that God has called us to in Madison and Verona!

Worship Time Update: I am grateful to the Worship, Music and Arts (WMA) Committee for their hard work in administering the worship times and styles survey this summer! We received over 550 responses; a phenomenal response rate from our church!

The Church Board acted in July, upon the recommendation of WMA Committee, to make the following changes in our worship time structure:

Worship times at the Madison campus will change beginning September 10 to 8:30 and 10am while worship times at the Verona campus will remain at 9, 10:30am and 6pm.

The worship changes at Madison campus will help us achieve several goals:

1. We will rebalance our worship offerings given that we have moved from three services to two on Sunday mornings at the Madison campus.
2. We are moving towards the "worship time sweet spot" of 9am as we reach out to families with young children living in the Meadowood and Orchard Ridge neighborhoods.
3. We will be able to offer church school at all services with children participating in both worship and education at both campuses on Sunday mornings.
4. A desire by congregation members, as well as the pastors, for more fellowship time between services, coupled with the need to turn-over the parking lot and sanctuary in time for a second service, meant looking for 30 minutes between services.

With change, it is nearly impossible to meet every need for every one of our members. I am asking you to consider not just the present but the future of Good Shepherd.

What will the "style" of the Madison campus worship be?

The best way I can answer that is that if you have been at any of the Madison campus worship services this summer you have already caught a glimpse of the direction we are moving in worship! Ben Johnston-Urey is composing a "Good Shepherd" worship service (a liturgy) that seeks to activate the gifts of many of our members.

What about the Saturday evening service hiatus?

We will continue to hold the former Saturday evening service on "hiatus" through at least the end of this year. We are committed to working on a solution for an alternative to Sunday morning worship that is mission-focused and high quality. I encourage you to check in with The Deep on Sunday evenings at 6pm at the Verona campus.

And what about the Verona campus?

Pastor Dara and Board Secretary Josh Enslin are working on a Verona Renewal process that will ultimately lead to structural, programmatic and mission recommendations. Pr. Dara will be updating the Board and congregation regularly as that process unfolds. Next steps include formation of a Verona Renewal Task Force to involve members of Good Shepherd in this vital conversation.

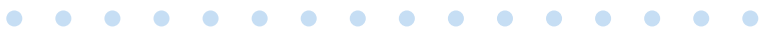

MENTAL HEALTH

Mental Health Tid Bits

This column is to help Good Shepherd members be proactive about their mental health. Today's topic is CARE GIVING THE MENTALLY ILL

Since 1 in 25 Americans live with a serious mental illness, it follows that many of us will find ourselves in some form of care-giving to a friend or relative who develops a mental condition. This is especially true since in any given year, only 60% of people afflicted with mental illness get the health care they need for treatment from professionals. In my clinical practice I have counseled many family members stressed out by their loved one's mental condition and expectations of care-giving from them. This is a most difficult road to travel with many crises, a huge learning curve, and challenges on how to stay yourself healthy while showing compassionate care to your loved one. Taking care of yourself in this situation is most important, since there are many unusual demands made, let alone facing the stigma society has by misunderstandings of mental health conditions. .When someone has a mental health condition, support from family can make a big difference. And this includes support from our church family as well. If you are coping with mental illness in your family, you can acquire better skills for offering support by reaching out for help. Our local Dane County chapter of NAMI has a caregiver support group that meets twice a month. Or, you can reach out to a pastor or myself to discuss your particular needs and stressors as you are care-giving someone with a mental condition. You are not alone and need not remain isolated from the support you deserve. My office phone number is 608-6630763 x380 where you can leave me a message.

At the end of June, a group of Good Shepherd members sat down together and pondered the words above from Romans 12. As we begin the process of thinking about the Verona Campus renewal, we begin by first recognizing who we are. And we know that first and foremost we are the Body of Christ. During our meeting we considered questions about the identity of Verona campus including what are our greatest assets as a church? and what brought you to Good Shepherd- Verona Campus? The responses varied but shared some common themes. Many appreciate the welcome and openness of our congregation. 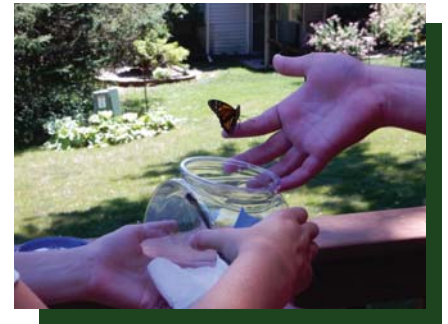
