

Fall brings with it a new program year of mission and ministry. The promise of the resurrection of Jesus Christ is the Gospel Good News that continues to energize us as God's people year after year at Good Shepherd!

This coming year will be unlike any of the years that preceded it. We are entering into a new era of ministry as a congregation and I am excited about where God is leading us in the Holy Spirit. There will be many opportunities to engage in this conversation as well and there is no set date and no set outcome to these conversations. My hope is that we

can move through this
conversation dedicated to the unity
we have already found in Jesus
Christ and without calling into
question the dignity or humanity
of any of our siblings in Christ no
matter which perspective they
are coming from. We seek to be
an authentic community that
welcomes all people.
And finally, please welcome Becca

Mortensen to the Good Shepherd church staff as our new Director of Youth and Family Ministry. I am grateful to the Youth and Family committee and the entire Children, Youth and Family staff for their prayerful discernment on who God has led to walk alongside us in this important area of ministry. Becca, myself, the Youth and Family Committee and Sarah Iverson will be working together to make the coming months a smooth transition as Sarah begins her new role as Director of Spiritual Programming and Development. 

Mission in Motion/General Fund Update





This month, we want to update you on our current Mission in Motion (MIM) campaign, which has been used to raise funds to pay the mortgage, make improvements to both campuses and create a reserve for six months of mortgage payments.

Until this year, MIM campaign donations were on pace to keep up with the intents to give from our initial campaign. But we have fallen behind in collecting intents to give for this campaign, which ends on December 31, 2018.

Our current giving shortfall is over \$265,000. It's anticipated to be more than \$200,000 by the end of the campaign if giving continues at the same pace. Our current mortgage payment is \$22,850 per month. In more than half the months of 2018, we have not collected enough contributions to meet our mortgage payment target. This gap has not kept donations already made in previous years from making a positive impact. We have made long-needed improvements in the Narthex and Peterson Hall and renovated the restrooms in Madison. Due to initial generous gifts, prepayments on intents to give, and continued monthly receipts, we have maintained our six-months payment cash reserve and are meeting all our monthly mortgage obligations. However, we will need to use more of our reserve funds than anticipated if we continue this trend.

Thank you for your generosity and continued support of Good Shepherd. RIC Task Force launches effort for congregation to consider a welcome to all just as God welcomes all.

Good Shepherd's Reconciling in Christ (RIC) Task Force is exploring to what degree our congregation extends a welcome and a message of belonging to people of all races, socio-economic circumstances, sexual orientations, gender identities and expressions, political affiliations, and levels of belief or doubt. Unfortunately, these

groups continue to experience exclusion and harm. Even churches that declare "All are welcome" often demonstrate to these societally marginalized groups that the welcome does not include them. For this reason, the invitation must

specifically mention such groups. Many of our new and longstanding members speak of the welcome they felt when first walking through our doors and how that impacted their decision to make Good Shepherd their church home. This task force is the next step in our congregation's commitment to hospitality for all people. The RIC Task Force has been recognized by the Good Shepherd Board and has collaborated with Good Shepherd's Leadership Team, conducting over 50 conversations with church members and leaders about deepening and expanding our public welcome. Feedback has been positive; expressing a desire to walk this journey together as we learn

more about who we are. Engaging in a welcoming process will deepen the faith life of Good Shepherd. The process Good Shepherd's RIC Task Force is following for gracefully engaging ELCA congregations in such conversation about welcome comes from Reconciling Works, a Lutheran organization that has been doing this work since 1974. Within the next 6-12 months, this process will help us to discern if we should adopt a welcome statement something like the following: "We welcome all who are seeking God's love and grace. We welcome all because God welcomes all, regardless of race or culture, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, or relationship status. We welcome all without regard to addictions, physical or mental health, imprisonment, socio-economic

> circumstances, or anything that too often divides us. Our unity is in Christ."More sample welcome statements


