The Lutheran “secret sauce” is that we are justified by grace through faith alone.

There are no pre-authorized requirements necessary for us to be made right in our relationship with God. The justifying action, the event that took away the power of sin that separates us from God, was the death of Jesus on the cross. This understanding of God’s grace paves the way for all kinds of joy and freedom. Day by day, each of us is transformed over and over again by the trust that our primary relationship, the relationship with the God who created us, is not up for review and never will be again.

But all too often we stop there at the Good News: we are justified by grace... great! The logical next question is the one that falls off the page and that is, so what? We have no problem talking about what God has done for us. But we soon run into problems when we start talking about what God requires of us! God has freed us for a purpose: to be engaged in a radically different way of loving, seeing, and doing in the world.

For four weeks this summer beginning July 14 at the Madison Campus and July 21 at the Verona Campus, I invite you to listen and submerge yourself in Biblical stories of people who were challenged to act on what they believed. We will learn that even the most clear cut decisions require deep thought and prayer. We will be confronted with paradoxes and reversals in expectations.

We have been freed to be of service to each other and God’s creation.

The Holy CoW Feeding our Faith

On Sunday mornings, congregants flood the Madison campus parking lot, eager to get to the week's worship.

Right outside the entrance to greet them is a van and cart, both shrink wrapped to imitate a cartoon cow. Branded on the side is "The Holy CoW," or the Church on Wheels. What looks like a food cart is actually a mobile church that also serves food.

In the following months, both congregants and community members will see the Holy CoW in action at local events, providing meals and offering new opportunities to worship.

The CoW aims to explore the intersection between faith and food. "[The Holy CoW] is a tool that we're going to use to get out into the community and get outside our four walls to get to build relationships and explore the intersectionality between faith and food," Pastor Joe Brosious said. "We need to get out there and get the Church out to people ... where they're at as opposed to expecting them to come

to us. And we really think the CoW will help us to do that in a creative way."

"Food is a great equalizer", Pastor Joe said. Though it may look like a food cart, the Holy CoW is a certified new-start congregation in the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America that happens to serve food. A mobile church is a way for Good Shepherd to continue to actively serve the Community and meet people where they're at.

What originally started as a tow vehicle and an empty trailer, has now been transformed into a food cart with a fully functioning kitchen; complete with a steam table, a convection oven, a fridge, and a panini maker.

The Synod took over the cart a year and a half ago from another congregation, when it was called Table of Joy. To make it Good Shepherd's own, the church held a naming competition, where the Church on Wheels was submitted. The Holy CoW seemed like a natural progression from there and fit right in with Wisconsin dairy culture.

The CoW has already started the process of debuting in the neighborhood. In the coming

months, it'll make appearances with Life 102.5, a Christian radio station, to help with some of their annual fund-raisers, other events include: farmers markets and fairs. The CoW will also be holding free meals Thursday nights throughout the summer in and around the Meadowood Neighborhood, starting at Good Shepherd.

So far, the ministry – also known as the Moo Crew – has made appearances at Good Shepherd events, including Vacation Bible School, where freeze pops and comfort food were handed out

"People connect through food and we're used to that as human beings," Pastor Joe said. "[The Holy CoW] breaks down barriers, allowing the opportunity to feel like it's a safe space and approachable allowing the opportunity to have conversations that we would never be able to have from people coming through our doors."

What is a Columbarium?

A columbarium houses urns of cremated ashes. As cremations become more common, Good Shepherd Church built a columbarium at our Verona campus in 2014 to provide a peaceful final resting place for members and friends of the church. Many members have already purchased a niche to relieve loved ones of the need to handle these arrangements. Each niche in our columbarium can hold two sets of ashes, and can be purchased at any time. Niches range in price from \$2000 to \$2500 and this fee includes interring the remains and engraving the granite faceplate. If you are interested in purchasing a niche or just learning more about our columbarium, please contact Rick Blum at (608) 271-6633 or rblum@gslcwi.com. Please feel free to visit our beautiful columbarium at any time.

Memorial pavers are also available around the columbarium niches and gardens.

Pavers can be purchased to honor or remember a loved one, or simply given to the glory of God. Pavers cost \$200, and for installation in 2019, must be ordered by July 15th. Order forms are available at either campus, or by contacting Rick Blum at (608) 271-6633 or rblum@gslcwi.com.

How do I include Good Shepherd in my Estate Planning?

Often people are prompted to work with an attorney to establish a will once they have children to ensure they are taken care of if something should happen. Did you know that there are also ways to take care of your church and ensure Christ's mission continues?

A gift to the Good Shepherd Lutheran Church Foundation can be identified in your will. The gift can be for a specific amount or a percentage of your remaining assets at the time of death. Another option is to



establish a trust for a fixed amount or percentage of income that names the Foundation as the beneficiary.

Similarly, a charitable gift annuity can be established where the remaining value of the annuity can be gifted to the Foundation. Yet another option would be to name the Good Shepherd Lutheran Church Foundation as a beneficiary of a life insurance policy.

An attorney should be consulted if you are interested in any of these options.

"Growth of Pines" A Reflection from Douglas Wood

Growing seems to be a common trait among living things. But I wonder if anyone's ever done it better than an old pine. If you're a pine, growth seems to have a lot to do with making the best of where you get started. Sometimes that's just a bare-bones, blustery, rocky outcrop of a place, inhospitable, with little soil or shelter, nurturing or encouragement. It may take a long time, but you somehow come to grips with it – this starting place. You reach and reach, stretching needy roots over naked granite, through tiny cracks, down into crevices. Serving Neighbors at Tree Lane

As part of Madison's Housing First Initiative, Tree Lane Apartments located on the far west side of Madison opened 45 apartments to homeless families in mid June 2018. Currently the Apartments house 49 adults and 97 children and are being helped by a staff of 5 social workers from The Road Home. While the families have successfully transitioned from homelessness, retaining jobs and providing steady schooling for their children, they still have many basic needs like furniture, bedding, towels, etc. God's Hands and Feet, a women's service group at Good Shepherd, hosted a "free" rummage and meal at Tree Lane Apartments in March. Thanks to the generosity of our members at Good Shepherd, 9 van loads of household items, bedding and small furniture were taken to Tree Lane Apartments. And yet, there is always need.
