

KEEPING NEIGHBORS CONNECTED Advent Jubilee | We Reached Our \$10,000 Goal!

A lot of Meadowood residents will be able to stay in their homes this winter, thanks to the generosity of Good Shepherd members. An anonymous donor has offered to provide up to \$10,000 to match any donation made to our Jubilee campaign to help Keeping Neighbors Connected (KNC). More than 40 households made contributions totaling more than \$11,500 as of December 22 to help us earn the match.

KNC is a collaboration of churches, schools and neighborhood social workers created through the efforts of Pr. Joe to make sure families in our Madison neighborhood receive help with housing. The pandemic continues to affect how we do things at Good Shepherd, including Souper Bowl XX.



The soup will be collected during the regular Food Pantry hours of 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. and again from 5:30 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. Preferred soups include chicken noodle, chicken with rice, vegetable beef, cream of mushroom, cream of chicken, any chunky style soups, and ramen noodles.

We are also asking for your help with monetary donations.
