VERONA CAMPUS CONSTRUCTION Creating Space for All at Verona Campus

As a part of our continued commitment to live into our church's Welcome Statement, we continue to improve our spaces, so they are truly welcoming for all. At Verona Campus we are converting our nursery space into a multi-purpose meeting space with a new all-gender bathroom. We will be painting, installing new carpeting, adding additional furniture and a new tv to create a lounge space. Most importantly, we are updating the bathroom with a full-size toilet and changing table, so it can be a usable space for families, caregivers, those with mobility challenges and our LGBTQ+ members and guests. They created a new opening from the main hallway across from the current bathrooms and walled off the two doors inside the room. Soon this space will be available for small groups and anyone looking for a relaxed meeting space at our Verona Campus or in need of a private bathroom.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH Serve Neighbors with Second Harvest

Second Harvest delivers food items for the Good Shepherd Food Pantry early Tuesday mornings. We currently have openings for Tuesdays in July – one volunteer needed and August & December – two volunteers needed for each month. The delivery times can range from 7:30 a.m. to 9:15 a.m. The "window" is posted late Monday afternoons. The time needed to put the items aways is approximately 30 minutes. You're Invited...to use your feet to bring clean water to those in need!

Danielle Sill shares how God answered her prayers through finding a community she could believe in at Good Shepherd.

I want to share with you what's been happening with Team World Vision over the last few years as thousands of people who are a lot like you and me have come together as a team putting one foot in front of the other to help solve the global water crisis by moving forward with Team World Vision and if you're reading this, I have an invitation for you! But first, I have to start off with a story. Have you ever had something on your heart that you've been praying about and in the most subtle ways God gives it to you? Well, that is exactly what happened to me.

Over the past few years I've been yearning to find an organization that I could be a part of that not only has similar values and mission to my own, but is something that I could truly get behind. Fast forward to finding this church in September, joining the worship team, meeting

Stephanie Christensen and seeing her post on Facebook that they needed an event planner for Team World Vision. I've looked at her and I looked at God and I said to myself "wow, God was speaking to me the most subtle ways." I sensed God saying, "you've been looking for this opportunity and I have surrounded you with people that are going to bring that opportunity to you." How amazing!

The more I learned about Team World Vision, the more my heart sung. As an epidemiologist and someone who spent time in Cape Coast, Ghana living with a family, I can attest to how impactful clean water is for a family. While in Ghana, I spent time traveling to rural villages and teaching about home remedies to common illnesses because many times when you get sick, you cannot get to a doctor. One of the most common illnesses I spoke about in

these rural villages was cholera - which is a disease caused by contaminated water. Today there are over 700 million people who don't have access to clean water. But we believe that we can defeat the global water crisis in our lifetime.

Now I'm inviting Good Shepherd to join me in this mission by training to briskly walk or run the Madison half or full marathon on November 13 for clean water. Training starts with just moving for 20 minutes! Do you have a feeling right now that you were called to do this have you always thought about running a half or full marathon? What if that is God working in a subtle way to get you to join this team and to be a part of a camaraderie to help children all over the world!
