This year, we are asking the congregation to use some of those reserves to make investments like replacing the leaking roofs at both of our campuses, increasing training for our amazing staff, and adding resources to our children, youth, and music ministries.

- A Strong Faith

Thanks to the work of the Strategic Planning Committee, our amazing staff and YOU, all these things are now in place.

BEYOND Capital Campaign Ends November 30

When the *Beyond* campaign started back in 2019, we had no idea the challenges Good Shepherd would face. Yet, despite the arrival of a pandemic, support from faithful and generous families to Good Shepherd and its mission to Welcome, Forgive and Serve has remained strong. As of May 31, we have received more than \$1.7 million in contributions toward the campaign. As we near the end of the Intent period for *Beyond*, we want to thank you for your generous gifts, and as you are able, encourage your completion of your Intent to Give to the campaign. Thank you for your support and encouragement of the ministries of Good Shepherd.

Because of your support to the *Beyond* campaign, Good Shepherd has:

- Added a new music room in Verona
- Remodeled our entire Verona Campus lobby and sanctuary
- Installed a new electronic sign in Verona
- Built up a reserve to replace the air handler in Madison
- Reduced our mortgage from \$3.1 million to just over \$1.3 million

We've also continued the mission of Good Shepherd over the past three years by:

- Baptizing 75 children and 4 adults
- Witnessing 86 teens affirm their faith in Christ
- Extending Good Shepherd's mission into an online ministry where more than 300 people worship remotely every week.
