Tell us a bit about what prompted the trip and who you journeyed with?

This was a pilgrimage/familiarization tour hosted and sponsored by Elias Tours, a company based in Bethlehem, Palestine, and Marietta, Georgia. Elias is a 20th-century child of Bethlehem and a third-generation tourism leader in his family. Elias invited me to join him last spring to travel with a group of ELCA pastors and church leaders to the Holy Land. He values not only the pilgrimage experience, but hosting those experiences to bring positive impacts both for the pilgrims and for the Palestinian communities on the ground. The global pandemic was devastating for the tourism industry, which is the lifeblood of the holy sites. It is good to rebuild the relationships that allow these life-changing visits to happen now and into the future.

What were some of the locations that you visited?

Familiarization tours are not vacations, so we compressed a lot of activity into a short amount of time. This means I am still processing all that I saw, heard, touched, tasted and smelled for sure! I can say without a doubt that kneeling in the place where Jesus was born and touching the ground where Mary gave birth will be a memory that is imprinted in me forever. Professionally, seeing the good work of the ELCA in the wider world was simply amazing. We had a chance to visit Dar al-Kalima University College of Arts and Culture in Bethlehem, and heard from its President and Founder, Rev. Dr. Mitri Raheb, an ELCA pastor. I remember hearing from Pastor Raheb back in the early 2000's when the university was still just a dream as he was touring the United States raising funds and partnerships. To see his vision alive and at work was amazing. We also visited Augusta Victoria Hospital, run by the Lutheran World Federation, which is focused on giving comprehensive cancer and kidney care to 5 million Palestinians.

Were you surprised at how emotional the experience was for you? What sorts of emotions did you feel?

I am not one to show emotions easily but one day had me crying three times: remembering my baptism at the River Jordan, visiting the place of Jesus' Birth, and hearing an impromptu choir singing Gloria in Excelsis Deo in the church at the Shepherd's Field. In terms of my pastoral heart, the cry for justice by the Palestinian people is hard to overlook when you are welcomed into Bethlehem, in the West Bank, for four days of abundant hospitality, grace and joy from a people who have lost so much hope.

What's something you learned about the people that live there now? About the Palestinian Christian community for instance?

As I stated above, it is easy to get lost in the weeds of cynicism and dread, but with people like Pastor Raheb and the partnerships that continue to be built with allies both locally and abroad, change is coming slowly but surely. The Palestinian Christian community is about 1 percent of the population of the West Bank. They absolutely love to build relationships with others while sharing about their own stories and culture.

Did you find anything you weren't looking for while there?

I found a renewed sense of who I am as a pastor of the larger church. I found some new friends from new cultures and discovered I like vegetables a lot more than I used to!

Will Good Shepherd be making a trip in the future?

Well, this was a familiarization tour, this means that my hope is that now having been on the ground and seeing the lay of the land, we can begin planning for a pilgrimage from Good Shepherd. It is one thing to share the stories. The hope for Elias and the people of Bethlehem, is to bring people *back* to see and experience the Holy Land through their own eyes. Tentative plans are that we will do this in the summer of 2024. Stay tuned!



All are invited to stop by Madison Campus for a free in-person meal at Good Shepherd on February 21st from 5-6:30 p.m.




February 22nd: Ash Wednesday Worship
