REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT MINISTRY Donation Event Gathers Supplies to Help Welcome New Neighbors

Dozens of volunteers from Good Shepherd gathered to collect donations April 15 to help a refugee family from Burundi. The initiative to start a refugee assistance program at Good Shepherd came from long time member Ross Lyman, who helped aid refugees at a church he belonged to in the Chicago area a few years ago. When he and his wife Cathy moved to Madison, Good Shepherd impressed them with their efforts at outreach — except for helping refugees. "I was surprised we weren't doing more," Lyman said. He started investigating the possibility of starting a program at Good Shepherd, especially since many refugees from Ukraine and Afghanistan were moving into the church's Meadowood neighborhood. He learned all refugee resettlement in the Madison area was run by Jewish Social Services (JSS), whom he had never worked with before. Yet he realized that Good Shepherd and JSS shared a common goal – helping refugees integrate into the community.
