

## HELP SUPPORT THE CLOTHES CLOSET Providing "Back to School" Clothes for Kids



The Good Shepherd Clothes Closet began when a single person had an overwhelming desire to bring a passion for serving to life. Barb Herbsleb had been a member of Good Shepherd since 1956 and was an integral part of the church throughout her life. In 2009, Barb was asked to be on a task force whose mission was to help support our neighbors. The committee decided the church needed a Children's Clothes Closet to provide clothes to children in need. In 2010, the Clothes Closet opened, serving 64 children the first day. That year, they served 722 children and learned a lot about how they could improve. The next year, they moved into two more rooms and served 2,735 children. Since 2013, Barb, her husband Bob and Doris Rasmussen, along with the other volunteers, have served over 22,668 children and continued to grow the ministry.

Even though Barb died in 2019, her best friend Doris remains a fundamental part of this mission, along with several other dedicated volunteers. Their goal is to continue Barb's mission by providing clothes to as many children as possible. Doris says her favorite part of volunteering is "being able to serve the community and see families able to shop and choose things for their children."

The Clothes Closet has experienced some challenges. Due to a shortage of volunteers; it has not been possible to be open in the evening and there is always a need for more children's clothing donations.

In the weeks ahead, the Clothes Closet is looking to revamp the space for the upcoming school year. The goal is to be able to expand the Clothes Closet hours to one evening each month.
