- 3. Topics discussed
 - Seeing several new families at Verona campus who previously attended Blackhawk Church. Joanne and Sarah's conversations with the families indicate that many are being drawn by our RIC welcome and inclusivity.
 - CHILDREN'S MINISTRY: First Communion class coming up. 10 youth enrolled, which is smaller than normal. Interestingly, Sarah also needs to arrange 1 baptism and 10 first communions for Amped students, prior to their Affirmation of Baptism in May.
 - AMPED: Going well, and we are appreciative for extra teaching support from Eric Holmer, Ryan Panzer and Greg Meyers. Amped Retreat on March 3rd will focus on the theme of Worship.
 - HIGH SCHOOL MINISTRY: Continues to grow in numbers and engagement. 32 students registered
 for National Youth Gathering this summer. Jennifer Herdina has been hired as a limited term
 employee to assist Sarah in the logistics planning for this trip. Fundraising efforts continue to
 minimize costs for travelers. High Schoolers hosted a Share the Love Camp for the congregation
 youth, leading the children through a VBS-style night of games, crafts, music and dinner.
 - FAMILY INTERVIEWS: Noelle LaConte presented the results of the family interviews that have taken place over the last several months. There are several key takeaways, such as a desire for increased multigenerational programming, and training for staff who are often in the role of providing pastoral care.  - STAFFING: Small group working on a proposed staffing plan, which the committee will discuss in March and April.
