As you explore this catalog highlighting the various elements of this thoughtfully designed space, consider how you can be a part of helping to create a space for people to find peace in body and spirit.

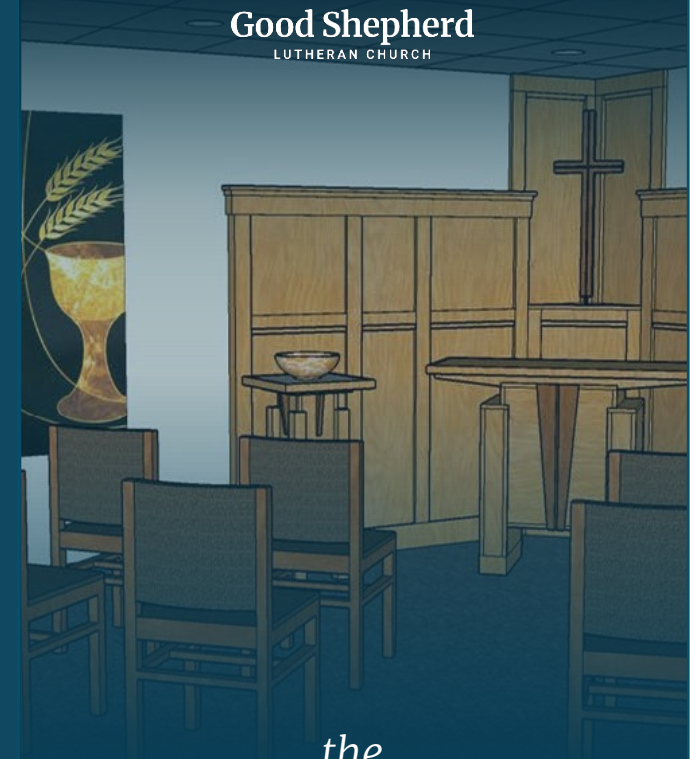

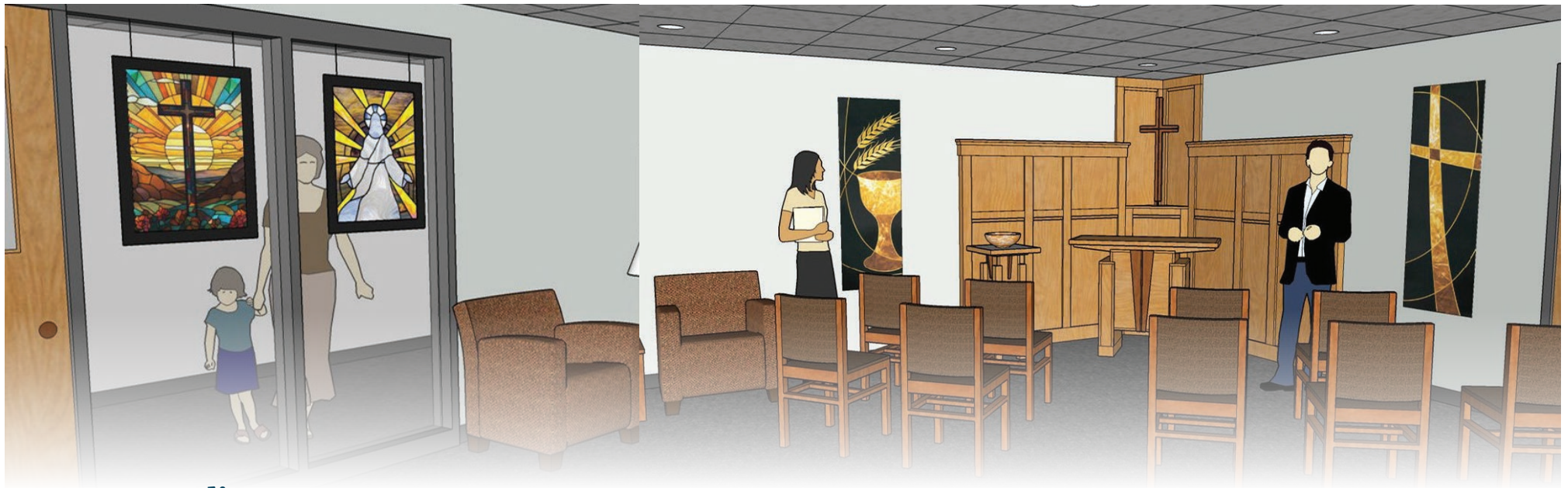
Longtime Good Shepherd member and local architect Mark Henrichs has been a part of developing the familiar elements of worship spaces in and around both campuses of Good Shepherd.

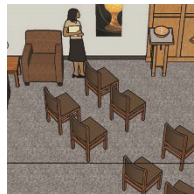

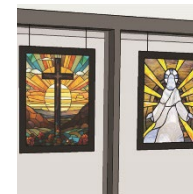

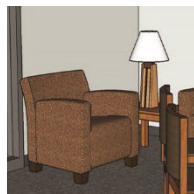
