they need a place to go for food and for fellowship, they can come to our church. Thank you to all those who help cook, volunteer and donate in order to make this meal happen! Whether you have attended or volunteered in the past, you are welcome to be a part of this beautiful tradition.

GOOD SHEPHERD COLUMBARIUM

A Peaceful Place of Final Rest and Remembrance



As we take time on All Saints Day to remember those who have gone on to their heavenly rest, it is also a good time to be reminded that the Good Shepherd Columbarium is available as a final resting place for you or your family members. Since its inception in 2014, the Columbarium has provided a beautiful, peaceful place of final rest and is a visible reminder of loved ones much like the old church cemetery once was.

The Good Shepherd Columbarium is located on the grounds of the Verona Campus and consists of walls with granite niches in which urns containing the ashes of loved ones are placed. There is also a peaceful garden, a statue of the Good Shepherd, benches for contemplation, and a soothing waterfall. In addition to the niches, the walkway around the Columbarium consists of stone pavers, which can be purchased and engraved as a memorial to loved ones. Benches are also available for purchase in honor of a family member, a friend, or the glory of God.

Columbarium niches are available to Good Shepherd members, their families and to friends of the church. There are currently 144 niches in the columbarium with 36 currently available to purchase.
